



# Fellow Placement Examples: United States



## Boston Public Health Commission

**Community Health:** Fellow helped coordinate and integrate evidence-based health services for hypertension, pediatric asthma, and elderly falls through the use of an electronic referral system in three key neighborhoods of Boston.

## Children's Health Fund

**Research and Evaluation:** Fellow evaluated programs and supported research for a network of primary care programs for underserved children across the United States—mapping 8 domains considered the primary “health barriers to learning” and developing economic analysis frameworks for the organization’s social impact.

## Covenant House

**Healthcare Coordination:** Fellows provided medical case management, wellness coordination, physical wellness assessments and health education for over 579 homeless youth.

## HIPS

**Health Education and Community Outreach:** Fellows facilitated the implementation of a harm reduction program through direct service delivery, advocacy, and community engagement. Fellows led outreach syringe exchange mobile teams, managed a 24/7 crisis intervention hotline, and coordinated overnight staffing for target demographic outreach.

## Inter-American Development Bank

**Social Protection and Health:** Fellows supported the development and implementation of regional operations to improve health outcomes in Latin America and the Caribbean; coordinating program launches, negotiating with multi-lateral organizations and compiling results for reporting. Fellows obtained approval for a \$500,000 technical cooperation project.

## IntraHealth International

**Policy and Advocacy:** Fellow worked with Frontline Health Worker’s Coalition to monitor and contribute to policy discussions at the US government level relevant to the organization’s work of supporting well-trained health workers—contributing to a UN General Assembly resolution with 62 UN mission co-sponsors.

## Last Mile Health

**Operations:** Fellow was responsible for finance and administration activities including managing accounts payable, bookkeeping, payroll processing and procurement during an unprecedented period of financial growth (from \$2.9M to \$9M).



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## Planned Parenthood Federation of America

**Advocacy:** Fellow coordinated advocacy strategies in Africa and Latin America, creating a model that informed the strategy for program officers working in 58 different partner organizations.

## UNAIDS/Together for Girls

**Communications and Advocacy:** Fellow developed inclusive content regarding gender equity, empowerment, and advocacy for a digital magazine. Additionally, fellow spearheaded social media campaigns that engaged youth all over the world on topics such as ending violence, resulting in over 4.3 million impressions on major platforms.

## Vecna Cares

**Software Development:** Fellows developed analytical data tools to measure impacts of projects in Kenya and Nigeria; enabling clinicians to record over 80,000 visits and follow-up care visits in accordance with Ministry of Health metrics.

## Children's Health Fund

Children's Health Fund is one of many placement organizations that have benefited year after year from the diversity of ways GHC fellows can contribute to the organization's work.

**2015-2016:** Fellows informed program development by conducting qualitative research, developing data collection tools, and conducting audits on program implementation that identified barriers to program success.

**2014-2015:** Fellows increased and improved health access for patients at a Federally-Qualified Health Center, screening 150 families for mental health and concrete service needs, coordinating weekly group prenatal and pediatric medical visits, and gathering qualitative and quantitative data to measure the health and behavioral outcomes of children and their families.

**2013-2014:** Fellows coordinated a clinic that offers integrated medical, mental health, and legal services, and a skills building group for undocumented migrant youth by developing a protocol for the clinic preparation, set-up, and follow-up, and by developing and implementing a monitoring and evaluation plan for the program.

**2012-2013:** Fellows conducted a six-month study with over 300 participants that highlighted the complex need for medical care in pediatric population in underserved, low access regions. Study findings help put vulnerable child populations in the view of policy makers especially with provisions in the Affordable Care Act.
